

PLAYWRIGHT

Janet Moran (she/her) is an actor, playwright and director based in Dublin. She co-wrote and performed in the hit play *Swing*, which toured both nationally and internationally between 2013 and 2016. *Swing* was published by Bloomsbury Press in 2015. She wrote and directed *A Holy Show*, which played a sell-out run at the Peacock Theatre as part of Dublin Fringe before transferring to Edinburgh Fringe, CCI Paris and completing a sold out Irish National tour in 2020. *A Holy Show* was also adapted for RTE Radio Drama on One. In 2019, she directed *My Romantic History* at the Viking Theatre for Verdant productions. In 2020, she cowrote and directed *Looking for América*, which played at the Mermaid Arts Centre as part of the Dublin Theatre Festival and at assembly Rooms in Edinburgh Fringe 2021. In October 2021, her new play *Quake* will have a development showing as part of Dublin Theatre Festival. In November 2021, *Pure Mental*, which she co-wrote and directed will tour Ireland. Janet is a participant of the 2021 Six in the Attic programme at the Irish Theatre Institute.

DIRECTOR

Tom Reing (Founder and Artistic Director, he/him) has made a career directing Irish and UK theatre in Philadelphia. Reing founded Inis Nua Theatre Company in 2004 to bring plays to Philadelphia that don't travel the Dublin-West End-Broadway-Regional Theatre route. Apart from his directing at Inis Nua, other work includes *Eden* for Brat Productions and *Molly Sweeney* for Amaryllis Theatre Company, as well as work for Walnut Street Theatre, Shakespeare in Clark Park and Revolution Shakespeare. Reing was nominated for Outstanding Direction of a Play for *The Radicalization of Bradley Manning*.
